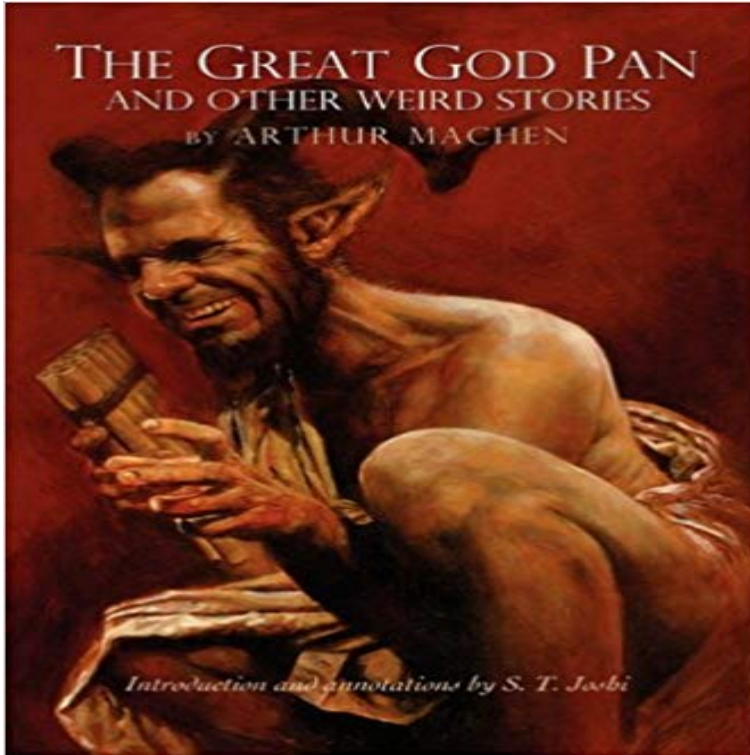


The Great God Pan
